The [Rev. Peter and Betty Burnett Awards](#) are exclusive for students (including graduates) of ECSOM who select [Option 2](#) as part of the [ECSOM PLUS](#) program.

In cooperation with Emmanuel Caribbean School of Ministry and our accredited partners, these awards are given in four grants over the duration of 48 credits of enrollment in your chosen degree with a partner institution.¹

Grant I: \$625

- Students who qualify for the first “Rev. Peter and Betty Burnett Award” of \$625 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen degree program.

Grant II: \$625

- Students who qualify for the second “Rev. Peter and Betty Burnett Award” of \$625 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a

cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more additional college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen program.

Grant III: \$625

- Students who qualify for the third “Rev. Peter and Betty Burnett Award” of \$625 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more additional college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen program.

Grant IV: \$625

- Students who qualify for the fourth “Rev. Peter and Betty Burnett Award” of \$625 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more additional college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen program.

Students must apply for these grants in writing by [contacting HQ](#) to express their intent to begin the “Rev. Peter and Betty Burnett Awards” program. Once all conditions above and below are met for each grant, students must provide notice of eligibility in writing by [contacting HQ](#) to give the appropriate permission for us to confirm with the accredited partner that conditions have been met.

- Eligible ECSOM students may elect to have these awards applied to ministry training at ECSOM, missions/ministry support, or other nonprofit (tax-deductible) endeavors that are approved in writing by HQ.

Students who qualify for these awards for the Hartwell Fellowship Program have three (3) years to use them on their ministry training tuition, outreach expenses, missions/ministry support (or other approved nonprofit internship endeavors) from the date they qualify for their initial award.

Please note the following:

- ECSOM PLUS students who choose option 1 can participate in the [Hartwell Scholar Awards](#).
- ECSOM PLUS students who choose option 2 can participate in the [Rev. Peter and Betty Burnett Awards](#) and help make [Adopt A Scholar](#) awards possible for others.
- ECSOM PLUS award programs are listed on the [ECSOM PLUS Grants](#) page.
- HQ awards and scholarship programs may not be “stacked” unless noted otherwise.
- Dismissal from ECSOM or HQ results in immediate disqualification for any HQ grant. Students must be in good standing to qualify for awards.
- Depending on place of residence, some students may enroll with [Hartwell University](#) to participate in the ECSOM PLUS program. Hartwell University is the sister institution of Hartwell Quest and both subsidiaries of [Hartwell Education, Inc.](#) (a social enterprise).
- No HQ grant, scholarship, or award pays for any aspect of or participation in Title IV programs. Grants are intended for ministry-related (non-academic) fellowship programs only.

- Awards for non-academic enrollment will continue based on academic credits successfully completed and will not “reset” by switching degrees.
- For students taking less than 12 college credits per semester with an accredited partner, scholarship amounts for non-academic enrollment will be prorated.
- Grants from these awards are given directly to nonprofit (tax-deductible) entities for non-academic student endeavors approved by HQ as part of the Hartwell Fellowship Program.
- HQ does not administer any aspect of participation in Title IV programs. Degrees associated with this fellowship program are offered wholly by accredited institutions. Hartwell Fellowship Program enrollment is optional and not required to earn an academic degree from partner institutions.
- HQ tuition, fees, and scholarship awards are subject to change without notice.
