LOREN AND DARLENE CUNNINGHAM AWARDS

Eligibility Requirements

FOR YWAM SCHOLARS STUDENTS

**Up to \$5,000 in Scholarships for Hartwell Fellowship Program Expenses
(Including YWAM Training, Missions, etc.)**

The Loren and Darlene Cunningham Awards are exclusive for students (including graduates) of YWAM who select [Option 2](#) as part of [YWAM Scholars](#) program.

In cooperation with YWAM worldwide and our accredited partners, these awards are given in four grants by Hartwell Quest (HQ) over the duration of 48 credits of enrollment in your chosen degree with a partner institution.¹

Grant I: \$1,500

- Students who qualify for the first “Loren and Darlene Cunningham Award” of \$1,500 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen degree program.

Grant II: \$1,500

- Students who qualify for the second “Loren and Darlene Cunningham Award” of \$1,500 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more additional college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen program.

¹ HQ does not administer any aspect of participation in Title IV programs. Degrees are offered wholly by accredited institutions. HQ enrollment is optional and not required to earn an academic degree from partner institutions.

Grant III: \$1,000

- Students who qualify for the third “Loren and Darlene Cunningham Award” of \$1,000 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more additional college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen program.

Grant IV: \$1,000

- Students who qualify for the fourth “Loren and Darlene Cunningham Award” of \$1,000 must be **1)** enrolled in the non-academic Hartwell Fellowship Program and **2)** enrolled with a cooperating accredited partner into a degree program and **3)** successfully complete 12 or more additional college credits (typically four courses) in the chosen program.

Students must apply for these scholarships in writing by [contacting HQ](#) to express their intent to begin the “Loren and Darlene Cunningham Awards” program. Once all conditions above and below are met for each grant, students must provide notice of eligibility in writing by [contacting HQ](#) to give the appropriate permission for us to confirm with the accredited partner that conditions have been met.

- Eligible YWAM students may elect to have these awards applied to ministry training at YWAM, missions/ministry support, or other nonprofit (tax-deductible) endeavors that are approved in writing by HQ.

Students who qualify for these awards for the Hartwell Fellowship Program have three (3) years to use them on their ministry training tuition, outreach expenses, missions/ministry support (or other approved nonprofit internship endeavors) from the date they qualify for their initial award.

Please note the following:

- YWAM SCHOLARS students can either participate in the [Hartwell Scholar Awards](#) or the Loren and Darlene Cunningham awards listed on the YWAM Grants page.
- HQ Scholarship programs may not be “stacked” unless noted otherwise.
- Dismissal from YWAM, HQ, or any accredited partner results in immediate disqualification for any HQ scholarship. Students must be in good standing to qualify for awards.
- These awards are forfeited if not used as prescribed within three (3) years of completing the conditions of eligibility.
- Awards for non-academic enrollment will continue based on academic credits successfully completed and will not “reset” by switching degrees.
- For students taking less than 12 college credits per semester with an accredited partner, scholarship amounts for non-academic enrollment will be prorated.
- Grants from these awards are given directly to nonprofit (tax-deductible) entities for non-academic student endeavors approved by HQ as part of the Hartwell Fellowship Program.
- HQ does not administer any aspect of participation in Title IV programs. Degrees are offered wholly by accredited institutions. Hartwell Fellowship Program enrollment is optional and not required to earn an academic degree from partner institutions.
- HQ tuition, fees, and scholarship awards are subject to change without notice.
